I have to have an appointment get my COVID-19 Vaccination at the Vaccination Clinic in Wangaratta.





If I need help to make an appointment, or help to go to my appointment for my COVID-19 Vaccination, David can help me.

David is the Disability Liaison Officer at Northeast Health Wangaratta.





Today I am going to get my COVID-19 vaccination.

Getting the vaccination will help prevent me from getting very sick with COVID-19.

My carer can come with me to my appointment.



I can wear a mask.

I will put on my mask before I get to the front door.



I will take my green Medicare Card with me.

I will also take a photo ID.



Someone will be waiting at the front door of the Vaccination Clinic.

They will ask me to check-in with the QR code. I can do this on my phone or my carer or one of the staff can do it for me.



When I walk in to the clinic I will sanitise my hands.



I will tell the person at the desk my name.

They will ask me a few questions so that they know who I am.



The person at the desk will tell me where to wait.

It can be noisy and busy at the Vaccination Clinic.

I can bring something that I like to do like my iPad, or something else to help me feel happy and safe.



When my name is called I will go in to a little room. My carer can come too.

The nurse will ask my name and when my birthday is.

The nurse will also ask me if I understand about the COVID-19 vaccination.

If I am not sure about the vaccination, or I am a little bit worried, I can ask the nurse some questions.

It is ok to feel scared.



The nurse will roll up my sleeve and clean my arm.

The nurse will give me the COVID-19 Vaccination using a small needle.

It might feel a bit like a pinch.



The nurse will put a band aid on my arm.



The nurse will give me a sticker so that I know what time I can leave.

I will go to another area to wait for 15 minutes before I leave the Vaccination Clinic.



If I feel sick I will put my hand up or tell a nurse so that they can help me.



The toilets at the Vaccination Clinic are outside.

If I need to go to the toilet I will ask one of the workers to show me how to get to the toilet.



I will leave out a different door to where I came in.



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
