What is the High Risk Foot Clinic?

Our clinic is a team of health professionals who treat high risk foot problems, including active wounds.

Our clinic provides a short-term service. We may transition your care to a community-based service for ongoing treatment if required.

What do we do?

We provide care to people with foot wounds or high risk foot problems.

If you have high risk feet, we will work with you and other health care providers to help treat your feet and prevent further problems.

Our care team

Podiatrist

A team of Podiatrists will manage your foot problem by:

- Assessing nerve and blood flow
- Walking assessment
- Wound care
- · Orthotics and footwear advice
- Communicating with your current care team

Nurse

A Registered Nurse will assist with your wound care and can review your overall health

Medical

A doctor is available to see you in the clinic when needed.

Dietitian

A Dietitian can assess your diet and provide education on the right foods, drinks and other specific dietary requirements for wound healing.

Diabetes Educator

A Diabetes Educator can provide assessment and management options if you have diabetes.

Referrals

You must have a referral from your GP or other health professional to book an appointment at the High Risk Foot Clinic.

Your first appointment

After we have received your referral, we will phone you to book an appointment.

- Your first appointment may take around 90 minutes.
- Bring your usual footwear/orthotics.
- You may bring a support person to your appointment.
- There is no cost for your first appointment.
- There may be costs for specific products. The Podiatrist will always discuss this with you first.
