Primary purpose of the position:	The Emergency Physician / Emergency Senior Medical Officer In Charge (EP / ESMO) is responsible for ensuring the day-to-day clinical operation of the Emergency Department delivers effective and safe high-quality patient care. The role includes direct clinical care as part of the senior staffing roster. The position works closely with the Clinical Director of Emergency Services (CDES), Operational Directors, and other senior clinical staff to ensure the Emergency Department achieves key organisational performance measures, develops and maintains effective working relationships within the Hospital, the region, with other service providers, key stakeholders, consumer organisation and the community.
	The EP / ESMO assists with change management within the Emergency Department to achieve ongoing improvement and delivery of safe, consistent, responsive and high quality services.
	The organisational structure encompasses a CDES, EP / ESMO, Junior Medical staff and Interns. Clinical privileges will be exercised within the scope of practice granted by NHW Medical Appointments and Scope of Practice Committee.

Key Accountabilities:

- Provide Emergency Department clinical services including regular "in charge" shifts as required by the CDES, and be willing to cover unexpected absence of medical staff (for example due to sick leave) if all other reasonable attempts to cover the position are exhausted
- 2. Participate in the oncall roster including weekends and public holidays
- 3. Support Workforce initiatives, such as recruitment, orientation, teaching and professional development
- 4. Support development of emergency response capability in Urgent Care services within the sub-region
- Support ED planning initiatives related to efficiency, quality of care and committee and working party participation

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- 6. Support quality improvement processes relating to clinical governance, risk management, accreditation, complaint and incident management
- 7. Review and create relevant ED hospital policies & procedures
- 8. Collaborate closely with relevant nursing staff and other health professionals in order to provide a multidisciplinary method of patient care
- 9. Assist the CDES as required in management of ED reporting, budgeting and cost management
- 10. Contribute to research projects relating to emergency medicine
- 11. Contribute effectively within and to a team environment
- 12. Promote best practice to all staff within NHW, but especially to clinical staff in the Emergency Department

- 5. Experience in teaching at undergraduate and graduate level
- 6. Effective communication and interpersonal skills as well as a belief in consumer-centred medicine
- Awareness of current legislation and policies pertaining to medical practice and the workplace including EEO, OH&S, Public Sector Management, Infection Control and access for clients with a disability
- 8. Participation in the Continuing Medical Education program of the relevant college

In addition to the above, all staff must have and remain current for continued employment, the following:

- 3. A current Employer Working with Children Check (renewed every 5 years)
